



June 2025 ISI Inspection Report

The Independent Schools' Inspectorate ("ISI") visited Moulsford in June, 2025 and we received the final report from the Inspectorate on 13th October, 2025. The report finds that the overall quality of the education and pupil experience at Moulsford is as strong as it has always been.

However, because of three administrative issues identified by the inspectors, the school has failed to meet some of the standards expected by the ISI.

These issues were as follows:

- **Our registration process was found to be taking 45 minutes to complete, which is more than the 30 minutes that the ISI requires.** We have subsequently adjusted our processes so that registration now falls within the 30 minute window. Issues identified with inconsistent use of coding for registrations have also been corrected.
- **At the inspection we were unable to provide evidence to the inspectors of a central record of notifications by the School to the Local Authority in the event that a pupil joins or leaves the school mid-term.** Since this fault was identified we have put in place an appropriate reporting system that rectifies this issue.
- **Our Boarder Counsellor, an independent adult that boarders can contact with any issues, was deemed by the inspectors not to be truly independent** because they are also paid by the school for one hour a week to provide a drop-in confidential counselling service. This situation was rectified as soon as we were made aware of the issue.

Unfortunately, these administrative failings, which the School moved to rectify as soon as they were discovered, have had a significant effect on the overall outcome of our ISI inspection report.

The inspectors have concluded that the School has failed to meet the required standards in the following categories:

- The physical and mental health and emotional wellbeing of our pupils
- Safeguarding

As a result of these two failings, the School has also automatically been deemed to have failed in a third category of 'Leadership and management, and governance'.

Our staff work tirelessly to ensure that the children in our care receive the highest quality education and experience, in an environment that is kind, caring, encouraging and safe. In fact, as you will see from the report, the inspectors praised our well-planned curriculum, our wide range of extra-curricular activities, and the consistently good progress our pupils make. They also confirmed our core commitment: that all children are safe within the School.

The School is undertaking a full review of administrative compliance and the ISI will reinspect us within the next twelve months. We are confident that the issues they have identified will be found to have been fully resolved.
